

Receiving instructions:

1) Compliance with laws, regulations, codes, and non-voluntary standards enforced in the location where the product is *used* is exclusively the responsibility of the owner/end-user.



Vestil diligently strives to identify foreseeable hazards associated with the use of its products. However, no manual can address every conceivable risk. The end-user ultimately is responsible for exercising sound judgment at all times.

AWARNING Failure to read and understand the entire manual before assembling, installing, using or servicing the product <u>constitutes misuse</u>. Read the manual to refresh your understanding of proper use and maintenance procedures. If this product is used improperly or carelessly, the operator and/or bystanders might sustain serious personal injuries or could even be killed.

• DO NOT exceed the maximum rated load.

• Inspect the dolly before each use. Remove the dolly from service if the inspection reveals damage *such as*: 1) cracked welds; 2) corrosion, extreme wear, or other condition that affects the ability of the product to support weight; 3) significantly worn or damaged wheels; 4) missing ratchet straps. DO NOT use the product until it is restored to normal condition. ONLY use manufacturer-approved replacement parts.


- DO NOT use the dolly to transport any cylinder that does not seat securely in the brackets.
- DO NOT transport a cylinder without firmly applying the ratchet straps.

• ALWAYS apply safe lifting practices whenever the dolly is connected to a lifting device (e.g. overhead hoist)


- When transporting a cylinder up-or-downhill, always remain uphill to the cylinder.
- DO NOT remove or obscure any label. All product labels must be readable and undamaged.
- DO NOT modify the dolly in any way. Unauthorized modifications automatically void the limited warranty (see p. 8) and might make the dolly unsafe to use.

NOTICE Proper maintenance and storage are essential for this product to function properly.

- Keep the product clean & dry.
- Repair regions where the finish is damaged with touchup paint.





Use Instructions:

- 1. Place the cylinder on the cart. Position the cylinder so that it rests firmly against the crossbars.
- 2. Release the ratchet to extend the strap, if necessary. To release the ratchet, pull the release lever toward the handle and pivot the ratchet handle as far from the ratchet base is it will travel (approximately 180 degrees). By pulling on the strap now, it will unwind from the spindle and increase the usable length. Ratchet parts are identified in Fig. 3B below.
- 3. Wrap the ratchet straps around the cylinder and connect to the J-hook to the J-hook slots of the divider (see Fig. 3B).
- 4. Pivot the handle back towards the base and let go of the release lever.
- 5. Tighten the strap against the cylinder by moving the handle towards and away from the base.
- 6. To remove a cylinder from the cart, release strap tension by following the procedure described in step 2 (above).



Maintenance:

When the dolly is delivered, make a written record of its appearance. Include observations about welds, the rigidity of the frame, and appearances of the wheels and straps. This record establishes "normal condition". During future inspections, compare observations to the written record to determine if the unit is in normal condition.

Inspect the dolly periodically (at least once per month) to confirm normal condition. If the inspection reveals problems, do not use the dolly until it is restored to normal condition.


• Examine the dolly for cracked welds, metal fatigue, rust, and corrosion that affects the structural integrity of the dolly. The structure should be clean, square and rigid, and free of rust and corrosion. Remove dirt and debris.

• Inspect the fork pockets. Each pocket should be square, rigid and structurally sound.

• Check the ratchets and ratchet straps. Confirm normal operation and condition. Replace damaged straps and ratchets.

• Inspect the lifting eye. Confirm that the opening is not elongated, widened, etc. The metal surrounding the eye should not be cracked, warped, etc.

• Labels: confirm that all labels (shown in "Labeling diagram" below) are present, undamaged and readable.



LIMITED WARRANTY

Vestil Manufacturing Corporation ("Vestil") warrants this product to be free of defects in material and workmanship during the warranty period. *Our warranty obligation is to provide a replacement for a defective original part if the part is covered by the warranty, after we receive a proper request from the warrantee (you) for warranty service.*

Who may request service?

Only a warrantee may request service. You are a warrantee if you purchased the product from Vestil or from an authorized distributor AND Vestil has been fully paid.

What is an "original part"?

An original part is a part <u>used to make the product as shipped</u> to the warrantee.

What is a "proper request"?

A request for warranty service is proper if Vestil receives: 1) a photocopy of the <u>Customer Invoice</u> that displays the shipping date; AND 2) a <u>written request</u> for warranty service including your name and phone number. Send requests by any of the following methods:

In the written request, list the parts believed to be defective and include the address where replacements should be delivered.

What is covered under the warranty?

After Vestil receives your request for warranty service, an authorized representative will contact you to determine whether your claim is covered by the warranty. Before providing warranty service, Vestil may require you to send the entire product, or just the defective part or parts, to its facility in Angola, IN. The warranty covers defects in the following <u>original dynamic components</u>: motors, hydraulic pumps, electronic controllers, switches and cylinders. It also covers defects in <u>original</u> parts that wear under normal usage conditions ("<u>wearing parts</u>"), such as bearings, hoses, wheels, seals, brushes, and batteries.

How long is the warranty period?

The warranty period for original components is <u>90 days</u>. The warranty period begins on the date when Vestil ships the product to the warrantee. If the product was purchased from an authorized distributor, the period begins when the distributor ships the product. Vestil may extend the warranty period for products shipped from authorized distributors by *up to* 30 days to account for shipping time.

If a defective part is covered by the warranty, what will Vestil do to correct the problem?

Vestil will provide an appropriate replacement for any *covered* part. An authorized representative of Vestil will contact you to discuss your claim.

What is not covered by the warranty?

- 1. Labor;
- 2. Freight;
- 3. Occurrence of any of the following, which automatically voids the warranty:
 - Product misuse;
 - Negligent operation or repair;
 - Corrosion or use in corrosive conditions;
 - Inadequate or improper maintenance;
 - Damage sustained during shipping;
 - Accidents involving the product;

• <u>Unauthorized modifications</u>: DO NOT modify the product IN ANY WAY without first receiving written authorization from Vestil. Modification(s) might make the product unsafe to use or might cause excessive and/or abnormal wear.

Do any other warranties apply to the product?

Vestil Manufacturing Corp. makes no other express warranties. All implied warranties are disclaimed to the extent allowed by law. Any implied warranty not disclaimed is limited in scope to the terms of this Limited Warranty.
